The children teamed up with a Gosport Primary School and worked together as a team winning the wildlife challenge out of 3 schools. Well done!! You represented the school proudly and had a fantastic time. We have lots of exciting activities planned this term for Camo club and have had a serving parent express their interest in coming in to speak with the children in Camo club and assembly which will be great.









#### Safeguarding

We all use ICT for professional purposes and use a broad range of tools to fulfil our work requirements. Children and young people mostly use ICT because it is fun. It is fun to play, it is fun to learn with: in many situations it makes the teaching and learning easier, collaborative and more productive. Some adults will shy away at the











sheer mention of computers or technology for a variety of reasons: have never used it; don't ever want to use it; scared of it; were not brought up with it; had a bad experience of it.....etc. Technology development is moving fast and it is important to try and keep up to date and be aware of the dangers posed to our children. Safeguarding Children at Grateley Primary School

Grateley Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. This means that we have a Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy and procedures in place, which we refer to in our prospectus. All staff, including supply staff, volunteers and governors, must ensure that they are aware of these procedures. Parents and carers are welcome to read the Policy on request. Sometimes we may need to share information and work in partnership with other agencies when there are concerns about a child's welfare. We will ensure that our concerns about our pupils are discussed with his/her parents/carers first unless we have reason to believe that such a move would be contrary to the child's welfare.

Our Designated Safeguarding Leads are: Mrs A Norman – Acting Head Teacher Miss D Knights – Class Teacher Safeguarding Governor is: Mrs Victoria Rutherford Our Chair of Governors is: Mrs Amelia Bridges

If you are concerned about a child's welfare, please record your concern, and any observations or conversation heard, and report to one of the Designated Safeguarding Leads as soon as possible on the same day.

DO NOT conduct your own investigation.

If your concerns relate to the actions or behaviour of a member of staff (which could suggest that he/she is unsuitable to work with children) then you should report this to the head teacher in confidence. If the concern relates to the Head Teacher you contact the Local Authority Designated Officers, LADO, on 01962 876364, who will consider what action to take.
